LOOSE FUEL CAP

- A LOOSE FUEL CAP warning message will appear in the twin trip odometer display of when the fuelfiller cap is not tightened correctly.

TIRE PRESSURE MONITORING SYSTEM (TPMS)

- A CHECK... TIRE... PRES... warning message 1 will appear as scrolling text in the twin trip odometer 2 and the low tire pressure warning light 3 will illuminate when one or more tires are low on pressure and air is needed.
 - The tire pressures should be checked when the tires are cold.
 The tires are considered cold after the vehicle has been parked for 3 hours or more or driven less than 1 mile (1.6km) at moderate speeds.
- After tire pressures are adjusted, drive the vehicle at speeds above 16 MPH (25km/h). The CHECK TIRE PRES warning message and low tire pressure warning light will disappear.
- When the low tire pressure warning light flashes for approximately 1 minute and then remains on, the TPMS is not functioning properly. Have the system checked by a NISSAN dealer.
- Tire pressure rises and falls depending on the heat caused by the vehicle's operation and the outside temperature. Low outside temperature can lower the temperature of the air inside the tire, which can cause a lower tire inflation pressure. This may cause the low tire pressure warning light to illuminate. If the warning light the temperature about





light illuminates in low ambient temperature, check the tire pressure in your tires.

- Check the tire pressures (including the spare tire) often and always prior to long distance trips.



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




INTELLIGENT KEY BATTERY DISCHARGE
